Who delivers the classes?

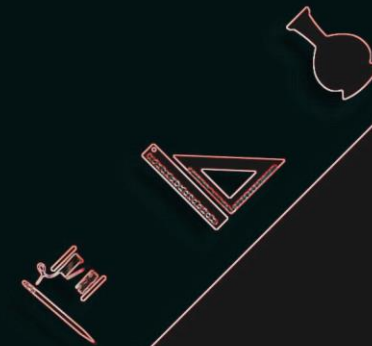
The classes are run in partnership with the City of London Adult Skills and Education Service

Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools

Cache Level 3

Fee: £1987 Adult Learner loan

Wednesday

9:30am – 1.30pm

This full Level 3 Certificate course is the natural progression for those who have achieved the Level 2 qualification. The course will build your confidence and awareness around your role and responsibilities, as well as equipping you with a range of skills, knowledge and experiences to enable you to excel in your job. You must be working in Primary or Secondary education (not Early Years) for a minimum of eight hours a week.

If this is your first full level 3 you may be eligible for an adult learner loan. 19 to 23 years olds accessing first full level 3 the course will be fully funded.

Learners aged 19 to 23 who previously achieved level 3 and 24+ employed and **unemployed accessing first level 3 course, this will be loan funded**
