Councillors had some discussion about this but decided that children had the chance to do this when they got into key stage two. Mr Wilson suggested that children could sit on the benches at Key Stage 1 assemblies. • One or two councillors thought that a bug hotel would be a good ideas on the playground. • Councillors suggested that we should have slush puppies at the summer market this year. • Year 2 noted that sometimes they didn't have sharp pencils in the classroom. <p>Problems</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children reported that the balls attached to hoops had been good on the playground but that they broke really easily. • Key stage two had come out to play on a couple of occasions recently and Key Stage one was still on the playground. • School councillors then had a long discussion about boys and girls football. Some of the girls felt that the boys were too rough when they were playing football and this put them off playing. For example, one councillor said that the tackles could be really hard at time. Councillors discussed having a girls only football session on the main playground. • Councillors said that the tables had been dirty on occasions in the dining hall. Councillors then discussed how it would be good for children to clean up after themselves at the end of meals. • It was agreed to create monitor jobs for tables for children to be responsible for cleaning the table at the end of the meal. Councillors agreed to ask in phase assembly whether this would be a job that children would like to do. • Wifi in Class 5 was reported to still be an issue. There were also some concerned in classes about the amount of time the Chromebook were available. • Councillors reported that there was still a bit of silliness in the toilets at lunchtime.
