Challenge: Create a dialogue using the model and extra vocabulary to help you. You can choose which places to include, and you can also choose who you want the dialogue to be between; mine is between two characters called Ben and Lili.

Ben : Bonjour Lili

Lili : Salut Ben

Ben : Quel temps fait-il aujourd'hui à Londres ?

Lili : Aujourd'hui il fait beau mais il y a du vent

Ben : Oui, à Londres il fait vingt-six degrés

Lili : Quel temps fait-il à Paris aujourd'hui ?

Ben : À Paris il y a du soleil et il fait beau. Il fait vingt-huit degrés

Lili : À bientôt

Ben : Au revoir

Bonjour – Hello **Salut** – Hi
Quel temps fait-il ? – What is the weather like?
Aujourd'hui – Today
À Londres – In London
Mais – but **Et** – and
Il fait vingt-six degrés – It's 26 degrees

C'est (à gauche/droite) – It is (on your left/right)
